HEW HOBO MYSTERY PREHISTORIC BIRDBONE FLUTE FOUND IN GERMANY

A prehistoric birdbone flute was uncovered in a German cave. It is believed that the flute is the oldest handcrafted musical instrument in existence.

A team of archaeologists assembled the flute from twelve pieces of griffon vulture bone scattered in a small plot of Hohle Fels cave in southern Germany.

The flute is eight and a half inches long with five holes and a notched end. Age estimates run as old as 35,000 years.

The discovery of the flute is considered to be absolute proof that a society of humans, both complex and creative, existed at that time, and were making music with handmade instruments.

Neanderthals would be included in that society, because they also existed around that time.

It is interesting to note also that at the time of the Hobo Band trip to Europe, one of the members (a flautist) reported having lost his instrument while exploring a similar cave in southern Germany.

All that is known about the individual who lost the flute is that he was very old and usually played out of tune with a very limited range, and had a very bad temper, which may have led to the instrument's breakage.

No one in the band remembers his name, or even what he looked like except that he was very old. Whether or not he returned from the tour with the band is also a mystery. It is believed that the flautist was probably German and filled in the flute section for some of the concerts performed by the band.

One would have to assume that the parallels between the discovery of the flute and the German tour, which occurred in different time frames were entirely coincidental.
